Holy Communion is open only to those Orthodox Christians who are in good standing with the Church and have prepared themselves by prayer, fasting and a recent confession. Saints du Jour (May 24)

Venerable Stylites Simeon the Younger of the Mountain of Wonders and Nikitas of Pereyaslavl-Zalesski; Martyr Meletios the General of Galatia; Venerable Vincent of Lerins.

Apolytikion of the Resurrection – Plagal Tone 2: When Mary stood at Thy grave looking for Thy sacred Body angelic pow'rs shown above Thy revered tomb, and the soldiers, who were to keep guard, became as dead men. Thou led Hades captive and wast not tempted thereby. Thou didst meet the Virgin, and didst give life to the world, O Thou, Who art risen from the dead, O Lord, glory to Thee.

Apolytikion of the Ascension – Tone 4: Thou hast ascended in glory, O Christ our God, and gladdened Thy disciples with the promise of the Holy Spirit, having become confident of the blessing. Verily, Thou art the Son of God, and Deliverer of the world.

Apolytikion of the Holy Fathers – Plagal Tone 4: Thou, O Christ, art our God of exceeding praise who didst establish our holy Fathers as luminous stars upon earth, and through them didst guide us unto the true Faith, O most merciful One, glory to Thee.

Apolytikion of St. Basil the Great – Tone 1: Into all the world that received thy word went out thy voice; thereby didst thou divinely teach, explaining the nature of existing things and ordering the conduct of men. O venerable father, royal priesthood Basil, intercede with Christ our God for the salvation of our souls.

Kontakion of the Ascension – Plagal Tone 2: When Thou didst fulfill the dispensation for our sake and unite earth to heaven, Thou didst ascend in glory, O Christ our God, in no way parted from those who love Thee but remaining with them and crying: I am with you and no one will be against you.

Prokeimenon: Blessed are You, O Lord, the God of our fathers.

Verse: For You are just in all You have done.

Epistle: The reading is from the Acts of the Apostles.

(Chapter 20:16-18, 28-36)

IN THOSE DAYS, Paul had decided to sail past Ephesus so that he might not have to spend time i Asia, for he was hastening to be at Jerusalem, if possible, on the day of Pentecost. And from Miletu he sent to Ephesus and called to him the elders of the church. And when they came to him, he said t them, "Take heed to yourselves and to all the flock in which the Holy Spirit has made you overseer to care for the church of God which He obtained with the blood of His own Son. I know that after m departure fierce wolves will come in among you, not sparing the flock; and from among your ow selves will arise men speaking perverse things to draw away the disciples after them. Therefore, b alert remembering that for three years I did not cease night or day to admonish everyone with tears And now I commend you to God and to the word of His grace, which is able to build you up and t give you the inheritance among all those who are sanctified. I coveted no one's silver or gold of apparel. You yourselves know that these hands ministered to my necessities and to those who wer with me. In all things I have shown you so that by toiling one must help the weak, remembering th words of the Lord Jesus, how He said, 'It is more blessed to give than to receive.'" And when he ha spoken thus, he knelt down and prayed with them all.

Gospel: The reading form the Holy Gospel according to St. John (Chapter 17:1-13)

At that time, Jesus lifted up His eyes to heaven and said, "Father, the hour has come; glorify Th Son that the Son may glorify Thee, since Thou hast given Him power over all flesh, to give eterna life to all whom Thou hast given Him. And this is eternal life, that they know Thee, the only true Go and Jesus Christ Whom Thou hast sent. I glorified Thee on earth having accomplished the wor which Thou gavest Me to do; and now, Father, glorify Thou Me in Thy Own presence with the glor which I had with Thee before the world was made. I have manifested Thy Name to the men whor Thou gavest Me out of the world; Thine they were and Thou gavest them to me and they have kep Thy word. Now they know that everything that Thou hast given Me is from Thee; for I have give them the words which Thou gavest Me and they have received them and know in truth that I cam from Thee; and they have believed that Thou didst send Me. I am praying for them; I am not prayin for the world, but for those whom Thou hast given Me, for they are Thine; all Mine are Thine, an Thine are Mine and I am glorified in them. And now I am no more in the world, but they are in th world and I am coming to Thee. Holy Father, keep them in Thy Name, which Thou hast given Me,

that they may be one even as We are one. While I was with them I kept them in Thy Name, which Thou hast given Me; I have guarded them and none of them is lost but the son of perdition, that the scripture might be fulfilled. But now I am coming to Thee; and these things I speak in the world that they may have My joy fulfilled in themselves."

The Venerable Simeon The Stylite Of The Wonderful Mountain

This wonderful saint Simeon was born in Antioch in the year 522 A.D. during the reign of Emperor Justin the Elder. His father perished in an earthquake and he was left alone with his mother Martha. At age six, he withdrew to the desert to a spiritual father John under whose guidance he submitted himself to a life of austere fasting and prayerful asceticism to the astonishment of all who saw him. Enduring horrible demonic temptations, he received great comfort and grace from the Lord and His angels. The Lord Christ appeared to him under the guise of a handsome youth. After this vision, a great love for Christ burned in Simeon's heart. He spent many years on a "pillar" praying to God and chanting psalms. Under God's guidance, he withdrew to a mountain named "Wonderful" by the Lord Himself. Because of the name of this mountain, Simeon was surnamed the "Man of the Wonderful Mountain." Because of his love for God, he was endowed with the rare gift of grace, by which he healed every infirmity, tamed wild beasts, discerned into distant parts of the world and the hearts of men. He left his body and gazed at the heavens and conversed with angels, frightened and cast out demons, prophesied, at times lived without sleep for thirty days and even longer without food and received nourishment from the hands of angels. The words of the Lord were completely fulfilled in him: "He that believes in me, the works that I do shall he do also; and greater works than these shall he do" (St. John 14:12). In the year of our Lord 596 A.D. and in the seventy-fifth year of his life, St. Simeon presented himself to the Lord that he, together with the angels, may satisfy himself gazing upon the face of God.
