Saints du Jour (December 9)

The Conception of the Theotokos by Righteous Anna; Hannah the Righteous, mother of Samuel the Prophet; Narses the Martyr of Persia; Martyr Andrew the General ('Stratelates'), Venerable Theophanes of Docheiariou monastery on Athos; Consecration of the Church of the Resurrection (Holy Sepulchre) in Jerusalem.

Apolytikion of the Resurrection – Tone 3: Let the heavens rejoice and the earth be glad for the Lord hath done a mighty act with His own arm. He hath trampled down death by death and became the First-born from the dead. He hath delivered us from the depths of Hades, granting the world the great mercy.

Apolytikion of the Conception of the Theotokos by St. Anna – Tone 4: Today have the bonds of barrenness been loosened, God, having heard the prayers of Joachim and Anna, promised them openly that they should give birth, against hope, to the Maiden of God, from whom He, the infinite One, was to be born, becoming man, commanding the angel to shout to her: Hail, O full of grace, the Lord be with thee.

Apolytikion of St. Basil the Great – Tone 1: Into all the world that received thy word went out thy voice; thereby didst thou divinely teach, explaining the nature of existing things and ordering the conduct of men. O venerable father, royal priesthood Basil, intercede with Christ our God for the salvation of our souls.

Kontakion of the Conception of the Theotokos by St. Anna – Tone 4: Today the universe celebrateth the conception of Anna which is from God; for she hath given birth to her who gave birth to the Word, in an ineffable manner.

Prokeimenon: The righteous shall rejoice in the Lord.

Verse: O God, hear my prayer.

Epistle: The reading is from St. Paul's Letter to the Galatians.

(Chapter 4:22-27)

BRETHREN, Abraham had two sons, one by a slave and one by a free woman. But the son of the slave was born according to the flesh, the son of the free woman through promise. Now this is an allegory: these women are two covenants. One is from Mount Sinai, bearing children for slavery; she is Hagar. Now Hagar is Mount Sinai in Arabia; she corresponds to the present Jerusalem, for she is in slavery with her children. But the Jerusalem above is free and she is our mother. For it is written, "Rejoice, O barren one who does not bear; break forth and shout, you who are not in travail; for the children of the desolate one are many more than the children of her that is married."

Gospel: The reading from the Holy Gospel according to St. Luke (Chapter 13:10-17)

At that time, Jesus was teaching in one of the synagogues on the sabbath. And there was a woman who had had a spirit of infirmity for eighteen years; she was bent over and could not fully straighten herself. And when Jesus saw her, He called her and said to her, "Woman, you are freed from your infirmity." And He laid His hands upon her and immediately she was made straight and she praised God. But the ruler of the synagogue, indignant because Jesus had healed on the sabbath, said to the

people, "There are six days on which work ought to be done; come on those days and be healed and not the sabbath day." Then the Lord answered him, "You hypocrite! Does not each of you on the sabbath untie his ox or his ass from the manger and lead it away to water it? And ought not this woman, a daughter of Abraham whom Satan bound for eighteen years, be loosed from this bond on the sabbath day?" As Jesus said this all His adversaries were put to shame; and all the people rejoiced at all the glorious things that were done by Him.
