Our possum family loves to watch a parade. When St. Basil celebrates Pascha, the little possums are awed by the candlelight procession. We heard Fr. Peter announce that Sunday, March 8, is the Feast of the Triumph of Orthodoxy. On that day, the Church commemorates the defeat of the iconoclasts (the opponents of the use of icons

in services and private devotions). At the end of the liturgy, church members celebrate the feast by walking around the church three times, chanting, and holding up icons of our Lord, the Theotokos or their patron saints. At St. Basil, in recent years, it's been mostly children who do this. This year, as we start Lent, we hope that everyone will bring an icon from home so that all creatures can enjoy this special day as the Orthodox Church has done since 843.
