

A Message from the Parish Council on the Corona Virus

Dear Parishioners,

St. Basil has always been a good citizen of Metairie and Jefferson Parish. The Lord has blessed us with no active cases of the corona virus. We have acted cautiously, made our weekly worship available through livestreaming on the internet and provided additional sanitary measures. Sadly, the virus seems to be taking another swing at the community. Our Governor and Parish President have asked us to take additional and stricter precautions. Starting on Sunday, July 5, we are asking that all persons wear a facemask in church or in the parish hall. The only exceptions are the priest, the subdeacon, the acolytes and choir members during the liturgy when their duties require it. In addition, we ask that parishioners in the pews sit 6 feet apart unless they are members of the same family. We will have a limited supply of facemasks if you did not bring your own. Orthodox Thoughts from Theo, the Parish Possum Making the Sign of the Cross, Part 2



Last time, I gave you some simple guidelines on how and when to make the sign of the cross. Remember to form the right hand by putting the tips of the thumb and the first two fingers together. They represent the Father, Son and Holy

Spirit. The other two fingers are placed in the palm of the hand. They represent the human and divine natures of our Lord Jesus descending upon Earth. Here are some other times the sign of the cross should always be made:

- 8. At the words "Let us worship," Worship," and "We fall down..."
- 9. When the priest blesses the people with the Cross or the Gospel.
- 10. Before the dismissal, at the words "Glory to thee, O Christ God."
- 11. At the dismissal: May Christ our True God..."

The sign of the cross is **<u>not</u>** to be made when the priest says "Peace be to all," The blessing of the Lord be upon you," and "The grace of our Lord Jesus Christ..." but a bow is made instead. In some Orthodox churches, there are also times when the sign of the cross is made with a metania (bow), a deep bend at the waist followed by a touching of the ground with the right hand. This practice is not common at St.

Basil but you should free to do so if it is within your tradition! May your worship be glorious—God bless all, Theo
