

The Priestly-Martyr Athenogenes, Bishop of Sebaste in Armenia

Athenogenes lived in a monastery near the town of Sebaste with 10 of his disciples. During the reign of Diocletian, Philomarchus, a cruel persecutor of Christians, came to Sebaste. He arrested and murdered many Christians in the town. When he saw Athenogenes and his disciples, he told the elder to offer a sacrifice to the idols so as not to perish, as had the other Christians. Athenogenes replied to him: "O persecutor, those whom you mention as having perished have not perished, but are in the heavens and are rejoicing with the angels." Just then, a doe [a female deer] that the merciful Athenogenes usually fed with his own hand ran up to him and, seeing him in great jeopardy, began to shed tears. Even the wild beasts of the mountains had greater pity toward the martyrs of Christ than the heathens did! After cruel tortures, during which an angel of God comforted the martyrs, they were all beheaded, first the priests and all the fellow laborers of Athenogenes, and then Athenogenes himself. All were received into the heavenly homeland in the year 311 A.D.

At the end of the Divine Liturgy, please come quietly forward to receive a piece of the antidoron and exit the church temple without talking. During coffee hour in the Church Hall is the appropriate place to exchange personal greetings and converse with one another. May God bless your reverence and piety.

Orthodox Thoughts from Theo, the Parish Possum



One of the great spiritual classics of the Orthodox Church is a 19th century book entitled “The Way of the Pilgrim.” Its author is unknown, but is believed to have been a Russian monk. It tells the story of a man’s journey, on foot, across Ukraine, Russia and Siberia with little more than his clothes, a prayer rope, a Bible and a copy of the Philokalia. He is trying to learn how a person can follow St. Paul’s admonition to “pray constantly.” He finds the answer in the constant repetition of the Jesus prayer, “Lord Jesus Christ, have mercy on me.” He describes his struggles and tells the stories of the people he meets along the way. The book is a testament to the power of prayer. It can also serve as a guide on how the Jesus prayer can be used in our everyday lives. The book quotes St. John Chrysostom, who said that “no man can excuse himself from prayer under the pretext that he is occupied with daily cares or is not able to be in church. Everywhere, no matter where you find yourself, you can erect an altar to God in your heart by means of prayer.” As Nicephorus the Solitary counsels, “if you pray (the Jesus prayer) with great attention, the entrance into the heart will bring about a host of virtues: love, joy, peace, long suffering, humility, and others”. – Theo
