

The Holy Martyr Pelagia

Pelagia was a maiden from an eminent family in Antioch. During the reign of Emperor Numerian, the governor of Antioch sent soldiers to bring Pelagia to trial as a known Christian. The soldiers surrounded the house and called the holy maiden to come to the door. She greeted them, and when she heard that they were taking her before the judge, she pretended to be happy, and told the soldiers to wait for a moment while she went back into the house to change clothes. Then she climbed to the roof of the house, raised her hands to heaven and prayed to God for a long time that He receive her soul and not permit her virginal purity be defiled. God received her soul, and her body fell dead before the soldiers. St. John Chrysostom wrote: "Her death came about not by natural causes but rather by the command of God." And he continues: "Thus, this virginal body, more pure than any gold, lay on the ground; angels surrounded it, archangels honored it and Christ Himself was beside her."

Orthodox Thoughts from Theo, the Parish Possum



There are some important messages and prayers contained in the large icons of the church. Behind the altar table, there are icons of four saints. Each is holding a scroll. St. James, the brother of our Lord, admonishes us "Be ye doers of the word and not hearers only." St. John

Chrysostom's scroll proclaims "It is meet and right to hymn thee, to bless thee, to praise thee, to give thanks to thee, and to worship thee in every place of thy dominion." Our patron St. Basil's icon invokes the Lord to "Unite all of us to one another who become partakers of the one bread and cup." There is also an icon of St. Gregory Dialogos, a Pope of Rome from 590 to 604 A.D. He is the author of the Liturgy of the Presanctified Gifts. His scroll is a prayer that the Lord "Look upon us thine unworthy servants who stand at this holy altar as at thy cherubimic throne." In the iconostasis, St. Herman of Alaska urges that "From this day, from this hour, from this minute, let us love God above all." St. Anthony the Great observes that "A great work for a man is repenting of his sins before God and expecting temptation to his last breath." As we reflect on these iconic messages, may the meditations of our hearts be always acceptable unto thee, O Lord. ---Theo
