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<u>The Feast of the Icon of our Lady Nursing the Christ Child</u> (<u>Mlekopitatelnitsa</u>)

This is the name of the icon of the All-Holy Mother of God, which the Serbian St. Sava [Sabas] brought from the Monastery of St. Sabas the Sanctified, near Jerusalem. And so, the prophecy spoken of by St. Sabas the Sanctified, some 800 years earlier, that a certain Serbian priest by the name of Sava [Sabas] will come and that this icon and his crozier (staff) be given to him, was fulfilled. When St. Sava the Serbian visited the Monastery of St. Sabas the Sanctified, the monks recalled the prophecy of the founder of their monastery and gave to Sava the Serbian this icon and crozier. This icon [Mlekopitatelnica] was placed on the right side of the Royal Doors on the iconastasis, in Sava's hermitage [Isposnica-House of Silence] in Karayes [Mt. Athos] and the crosier placed in an adjacent cell known as the "Paterica."

Orthodox Thoughts from Theo, the Parish Possum



St. Cosmas the Aetolian attracted thousands of Orthodox followers in Greece and Albania during the 1700's. Murdered by the Turks in 1779, he was declared a saint and martyr in 1961. He taught that making the Sign of the Cross should be seen as an opportunity for prayer. After

joining the three fingers of the right hand together, we should touch the forehead and say "Just as the angels glorify the Holy Trinity in heaven, so I, an unworthy servant, glorify and worship the Holy Trinity. Just as the fingers are three, and yet one, so is the Holy Trinity three persons and one God." Next, when we touch the breast, we say "I worship you and adore you, my Lord, because you humbled yourself and became incarnate in the womb of the Theotokos for my sins." When we touch the right shoulder, we pray "I beg you, my God, forgive me and place me on your right together with the just." When we touch the left shoulder, we say "I beg you, my Lord, do not place me on your left with the sinners." After this, bending down to the ground, we pray "I glorify you, my God. I worship and adore you, for just as you were placed in the grave, so will I be." And finally, standing up straight again, say "I glorify and worship you my Lord, for you rose from the dead, granting us eternal life."—Theo
